Goal: Reducing extremist violence

Approach: tolerating extremists

- Extremists exposed to differing opinions, no echo chamber of awful, perhaps less chance of individuals becoming more willing to use violence
 - Idea X seems pretty extreme

Approach: removing extremists

- Extremists pushed into marginal spaces (like gab.ai and 4chan), less interaction with non-extremists, more echo chamber of awful
 - Idea X seems less extreme
- Being banned increases their sense of persecution, fueling grievances and the desire to fix grievances

Goal: Reducing extremism

Approach: tolerating extremists

- More opportunities for recruitment and mainstreaming of ideas (Overton window)
- Possibilities for deradicalization or disengagement through interaction with non-extremists

Approach: removing extremists

- Fewer opportunities for recruitment or mainstreaming of ideas
- Fewer opportunities for deradicalization and disengagement



Caveats

Banning extremists might make an individual more likely to use violence, while tolerating extremists might make an individual less likely to use violence.


• **BUT** tolerating extremists might mean a larger population of people who might use violence, so even if individual likelihood goes down, overall likelihood could go up



Banning extremists

Likelihood of violence = individual propensity for violence x number of individuals

Likelihood of violence given banning = increased individual propensity for violence x decreased number of individuals
