#### The challenge

- Overall terrorist threat picture
- Extensive use of online propaganda by the Islamic State
- Right Wing Violent Extremism and Terrorism on the rise
- The link between online propaganda and terrorist attacks?



#### **EU Internet Forum**

- December 2015: internet companies, Member States, Europol, RAN, and academics
- Two key objectives:
  - 1. Reduce accessibility to terrorist content online
  - 2. Increase alternative narratives online
- Voluntary initiative



#### **Empowering civil society**

- Empowering credible voices to challenge the terrorist narrative and provide positive alternatives;
- Civil Society Empowerment Programme launched in 2017;
- 250 CSOs trained so far to enhance technical expertise;
- Financial support provided;
- 17 projects funded.



## Reasons for a regulatory approach

- Terrorist threat
- Continued accessibility of terrorist content online
- Insufficient engagement potentially 360
- Insufficient response/transparency
- Need for a stable framework in the long term



- Single Market
- Public security
- Fundamental rights
  - Users' interests
  - Companies' interests



### **Terrorist Content Online PROPOSAL**

#### **MAIN ELEMENTS**



- Instrument of binding nature towards the HSP
- Assessment by MS removal by HSP in 1
   hour
- Feedback to issuing authority
- Inform MS of jurisdiction when final trigger proactive measures



- Reinforced referral system
- Not only MS law enforcement but also Union bodies
- Removal voluntary against terms & conditions
- Obligation to assess + feedback



- Overall requirement: be vigilant and assess the risks
- Step-by-step process for companies at risk:
  - Request to report on measures in place
  - Dialogue HSP national authority
  - No agreement: decision imposing specific proactive measures
  - HSP request to revoke



- Specific safeguards on proactive measures: human, oversight
- Complaint mechanisms, legal redress
- Transparency:
  - to the public (Terms and Conditions, annual reports)
  - to authorities (Reporting under proactive measures)



- Cooperation on removal orders and referrals
- Cooperation on proactive measures and sanctions
- Dedicated tools and channels, possibly ensured via Europol
- HSPs to inform authorities of terrorist offences



- Legal representative
- Monitoring
- Penalties
  - Proportionate, gravity, previous breaches
  - 4% in specific cases
