Extremism

- Extremist ideology: "a collection of texts that describe who is part of the in-group, who is part of an out-group, and how the in-group should interact with the outgroup"
- Extremism: "belief that an in-group's success or survival can never be separated from the need for hostile action against an out-group. The hostile action must be part of the in-group's definition of success. Hostile acts can range from verbal attacks and diminishment to discriminatory behavior, violence, and even genocide"




Imaginaries: the Red Pill & white genocide



 "ads on immigration and nationalism were particularly salient and intensively focused on white voters. Our results clearly demonstrate that data-driven political campaigns are adopted not just by resourceful political parties (Hersh, 2015; Kreiss, 2016), but also relatively low-resourced groups (Karpf, 2016...the system [enables] deliberate operations of political campaigns with undisclosed sponsors/sources, furtive messaging of divisive issues, and imperceptible targeting?" (Kim et al, 2018).

White identity politics aspires for the *return* of the institutional recognition of their superiority over others. What is termed "identity politics" (often as a pejorative) strives for the institutional recognition of the equality and dignity of minorities.

Only one set of claims is morally acceptable. But what has happened is that white identity politics constantly claims its own victimhood in order to camouflage its extremism as a righteous struggle for equality.










Facebook Facilitates Disinformation

(and Russia exploited an existing ecosystem)






Left: ads on Facebook by Britain First and identitarians Right: Network graph of interests targeted by Russian IRA in US, 2015-2017

Taking Care of Extremism

- We should not be afraid to balance the freedom of expression with the fundamental rights of dignity and a life free from fear. I did not speak much about work on victims of white identity politics, but those who bear the effect of its hate and hostility should be first on our minds when we conceive a response, not the media outlets, politicians, and "moral entrepreneurs" that claim their oppression.
- Does the free speech argument reinforce white supremacy by claiming that the (white)
 entitlement to offend is greater than another's entitlement to live free from fear?
